### **NOVEL LIT CIRCLE** – Requirements

CHOOSE A NOVEL TO READ. COMPLETE THE REQUIREMENTS BELOW ALONG WITH YOUR CHOICE OF GROUP PROJECT PRESENTATION OR ESSAY AS DESCRIBED. YOU WILL BE GRADED ACCORDING TO THE RUBRIC ON THE BACK SIDE OF THIS PAGE. CHOOSE WISELY!!

#### NOVEL GROUP MEETINGS & ASSIGNMENTS DUE May 14, 2019. PROJECT DUE May 17, 2019.

### GROUP MEETINGS/REQUIREMENTS:

1. Establish a **TIMELINE/CALENDAR/SCHEDULE**. Each group member will be required to complete assignments for the aforementioned sections by the deadlines established as a group. Roles are identified in an initial meeting (which DOES NOT count as a section for your novel).

2. Split the novel into **4-5 SECTIONS**. For each section, one person will complete one of the components (listed below) and rotate for each subsequent section.

3. <u>GROUP MEETINGS</u>: Establish within your timeline dates for completion and set-up meetings with your instructor. No more than three (3) groups will be allowed to meet on a given date.

### 4. REQUIRED ASSIGNMENTS:

A. **Vocabulary** – completely identify 20 words per section, with page numbers, context in which used from the novel, and part of speech and definition.

B. **Discussion Questions** – develop and answer 20 questions from the section of your novel. Add page numbers for comprehension-based questions but include critical thinking questions as well.

C. **Quiz** – Develop a quiz of 20 questions per section with a mixture of types of questions. They should cover comprehension, application of information, and critical thinking.

D. Literary Elements – Cite information (include page number & within the text for the set six for each section and 6 other elements as well. SET-6 are Plot, setting, theme, point of view, characters, and conflict. Others may include symbolism, foreshadowing, suspense, allusion, and figures of speech (metaphor, simile, onomatopoeia, etc.), among others.

5. **REFLECTION:** At the conclusion of each meeting, write a reflection of 100-150 words (properly formatted) to recall the discussion of the group, the assignments completed, a brief summary of the plot of the novel, and any other relevant information as pertains to the activity.

6. <u>PORTFOLIO:</u> As progress is made throughout reading, meeting about, and discussing your novel, retain all documentation in the required <u>GOOGLE DRIVE</u> folder as assigned by your instructor. Such documents will become a NOVEL PORTFOLIO and will become a grade at the conclusion of the unit.
7. <u>SUBMIT</u> ALL ASSIGNMENTS IN YOUR SHARED GOOGLE DRIVE <u>GROUP FOLDER</u> that you will create at the first meeting.

<u>POWERPOINT/SLIDESHOW</u> – Create a Presentation for <u>your novel</u>, as a lesson on the novel. Include these set six elements as well as parts of each of your group meetings & required assignments: <u>Vocabulary, Literary Elements</u> (plot, setting, characters/ characterization, theme, point of view, conflict, & others like symbolism, foreshadowing, suspense, allusion, FoS, & etc.), <u>Author's Style</u>, and three ADDITIONAL of your choice. It should be interactive and explain your novel to class. REMEMBER: it's a PowerPoint AND presentation. You will need to use your slideshow as an ASSISTANT, not have us read along with what you discuss from the slides.

## -- OR --

ESSAY: Research the elements of your novel as you read and complete your assignments. Include Setting, Plot, Characters/Characterization, Theme, Point of View, Symbolism, Author's Style, and THREE ADDITIONAL elements of your choice. CITE your source(s), and include direct quotes from it/them to PROVE your point.
